- Leave no trace of your visit
- Take your litter home
- Bring picnics not barbecues (fires start easily on the dry heath)
- Keep dogs under control and on the paths

ENJOY

the outdoors

- Read the signs on the heath
- Stop-Look-Listen to the sounds of the countryside
- Keep to the paths and stop to look at the view occasionally















Before visit...

PREPARATION

Provide children with A4 blank sheets of paper and explain they are producing posters.

INTRODUCTION

Using the What is a Heath? sheet and elements of A Successful Visit - Teachers' Notes, discuss the forthcoming visit and ask the children to consider how they might help keep the heath special by designing a poster.

You may want to give them the sub headings of RESPECT, PROTECT, ENJOY.

ACTIVITY





Leave children to design posters and keep for a discussion after the visit.

After visit...

PREPARATION

Provide children with their posters from the pre-visit activity.

INTRODUCTION

Using the Countryside Code exemplar, ask the children to use their own ideas to re-design and improve their poster to help the Pebblebed Heath staff to protect this wild place.

Send all, or a selection, to the Educational Officer at the Estate office.
